## **Membership of the Joint Industry Stunt Committee's Register.**

**Entry and upgrading within the Register is controlled by the Joint Industry Stunt Committee, operated by Equity in conjunction with the BBC, ITV and PACT. The Rules of the Register including requirements for entry (see appendix A) are attached to this letter. These requirements are subject to revision at any time and therefore applicants should check with the Joint Secretary (Equity) that the list they have is the current one.**

**It is a requirement that applicants who join the Stunt Register have completed 60 days work in front of camera, but please note this cannot include any form of stunt work.**

Once you have completed 60 days work in front of camera, an application may be made to join the JISC Register **providing that you are 18 years old or over**. You must provide evidence of qualifications to the required standard in **six or more** of the categories listed in Appendix A (enclosed), one of which **must** be in Group A – Fighting (**only one martial art is permitted**). Qualifications must be no more than 5 years old. The categories should fall within **at least four groups** but **not more than two categories** should fall within **one** group.

**You must have at least one year's experience in each of your qualifications. You must also provide with your application a video containing a five minute demonstration of each of your six disciplines. The video should not be creatively edited and should not have a music soundtrack.**

**I would draw your attention to the fact that the rules of the JISC Register state that membership granted on the basis of inaccurate or fraudulent information may be withdrawn at any time.**

A successful applicant will be taken on as a probationary member of the Register, which means that for a period of at least three years, he or she would be restricted to working under the supervision of a suitably qualified co-ordinator. The purpose of this is to provide on-the-job training in the techniques of film and television stunt work.
